What is a Spiritual Being?

In the opening pages of the Bible, God creates two overlapping realms, the heavens and the earth. This is where the drama of the biblical storyline takes place. Many of us are familiar with the earthly drama. Humans are given a wonderful garden to rule on God's behalf, but they lose access to this paradise because of a foolish rebellion. But the biblical authors want us to see another set of characters, the inhabitants of the heavenly realm who are also heavily involved in this earthly story.

For lots of different reasons, many modern readers of the Bible don't notice these characters or don't know what to make of them. Most of our modern portrayals of angels and demons are based on deep misunderstandings of what the biblical authors are trying to tell us about these creatures. Spiritual beings play a really important role in the biblical story, and that's what this video series is all about.

Intro to Spiritual Beings

In the first pages of the Bible, we're introduced to God and humans as the main characters. But there's also a whole cast of spiritual beings who play an important role throughout the Bible, though they're often in the background. In this video, we begin to explore these beings and how they fit into the unified storyline of the Bible.

APCM

APCMS/ANNUAL MEETING OF PARISHIONERS

The annual church meeting which had not been held by the time of lockdown in March has been deferred to Wednesday 7th October, 7.30pm in All Saints Church. Please bear in mind that the church electoral roll has to be revised in advance of the meeting. The roll is now available to be looked at in the church porch for revisions to be made.

The allowed numbers for attendees follows our current guidelines of safe seating's for up to 30 people but is subject to further Government or Church of England guidance nearer the time and any local restrictions. Therefore we will have to ask people to sign a list if they wish to attend in person. The reports will be available online, e-mailed out, issued to people without computers and available in church by Sunday 27 September. Bishop Rose has now signed a new statutory instrument to allow this year annual meetings to take place either entirely virtually or by both physical and virtual means. We will try to enable the Meeting to be attended via Zoom.

As an explanation

- 1. The APCM is a meeting for all those on the church's electoral roll. The purpose of this meeting is to receive the reports and to make elections and appointments.
- 2. The annual meeting of parishioners is a meeting for all those on the church's electoral roll and all those resident in the parish whose names are on the civil electoral roll of the parish. The purpose of

this meeting is to elect the churchwardens. The provisions concerning nomination in section 4 of the Churchwardens Measure 2001 continue to apply and some thought will need to be given as to how the nomination paperwork can be co-ordinated in advance of the virtual meeting.

3. The new arrangements permit the meeting to take place in a virtual 'location' (for example, on an interactive video-conferencing platform such as Zoom) and for voting to take place electronically rather than 'in person'. It does not change the procedural requirements for the convening of the meeting and notices of it.
