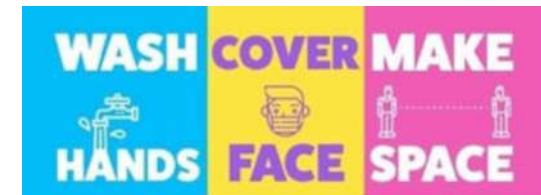

Dear All,

The PCC has decided not to start Church Services until Christmas Eve. We felt that it was not worth the risk, but to wait until Christmas when hopefully the infection numbers have come down or at least have stabilised. At the moment they are still rising in our area. Medway has one of the highest infection rates in the country. The decision taken was not unanimous, but a majority of PCC members voted against resuming Worship yet.

SUNDAY WORSHIP

Continued.....

For some it will be difficult to understand why we are not resuming worship in church. Please let me explain in a bit more detail why we have taken that decision.

By not opening the church for Sunday worship we are trying to reduce the risk of infections. The clear intention of the public health experts is to reduce interactions as much as possible so that we get through the winter without another wave of infection.

Each church makes their own decision and the majority of All Saints Church PCC has decided to take risk reducing measures by not returning for worship in Church, but to prepare for Christmas Eve and Christmas day with a Communion Service instead.

In the meantime we will continue with zoom, the telephone companion scheme (set up by the Rector during the first lockdown), the Hope worship telephone line for those without WIFI and of course there are many broadcasts on TV and programs on Radio.

As suggested by Bishop Rose how best to work together in Deaneries and Benefices is to list Churches in the Deanery that are administering Communion so that people can apply their common sense if they wish to attend. Please ring the Churches to let them know if you intend to go there due to the restrictions in the numbers that are allowed to attend.

Only yesterday (4 Dec 2020) did the Medway area, Tier 3, featured on the 10 o'clock news that the numbers of Covid infections are rising more than in any other areas where numbers have stabilised and/or are going down. Medway has now overtaken Swale and Thanet and we are the highest ranking Covid infected area in the country.



Coronavirus infection rates across **Kent** and **Medway** continue to soar above the national average.

Compiling data from Public Health England, we have created a graph to show how these rates have changed during the course of the second lockdown.

While infection rates for the neighbouring home counties seem to have levelled off or fallen away, Kent's figures have more than doubled.

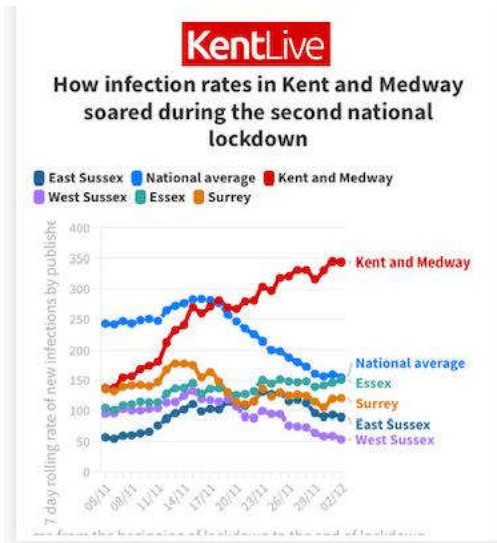

Just for information, Germany's lockdown has been extended to the 10th January 2021 and it is only briefly lifted for Christmas.

Since the first lockdown we have followed Germany a fortnight later!

The PCC is monitoring the situation regularly and will decide on changes at short notice rather than waiting for the time of an official PCC meeting.

I have informed the Bishop and the Archdeacon of the PCC's decision.

I am John Kimberley a Reader or LLM as we are called in the Oxford Diocese.

I first met Silke around 2005, when my wife was running 4 parishes near Buntingford in Hertfordshire. I am a scientist, have a MSc in Chemistry and worked as an Analytical Chemist for 5 years with Glaxo, before switching to be a Systems Programmer and IT and Internet specialist for the next 32 and a half years still with Glaxo until I retired.

I trained to be a Reader in 2006 and was licensed in 2008. I enjoy preaching and leading worship which I feel I was called to do, although that would have not been in my plans when I was younger.

I am severely sight impaired, but the Kindle and other devices have made it possible for me to keep reading and they are one of God's gifts.

I see science and religion as being much closer to each other than many people think. Science tells us how creation works, while the Scriptures tell us how we should live and the way we should behave. There have been many past misunderstandings between both sides and I try to help bridge the divide between the two. When the Old Testament was written, the authors wrote within the context of what they knew. In another hundred years people's views will not be the same as ours are today, but the essential truths will still be valued. We were given the ability to ask deep questions.

You and those you are remembering will be prayed for on Christmas morning. Babies and young children who have died will be prayed for in Church at 9.30am on Holy Innocent's Day.

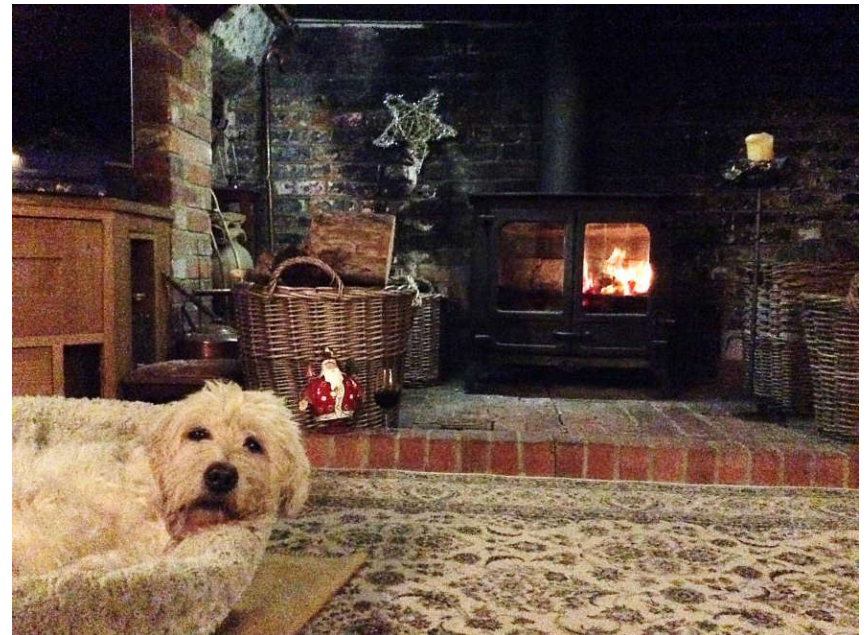
