Leaflets explaining suitable contents will be available at the back of church, or I can deliver them to you. I also have spare boxes – wrapped or unwrapped and I will need the completed ones by mid-October please. A £2 donation is requested towards the cost of transport.

If you are unable to fill a box but would like to contribute, suitable new items would be very much appreciated as would any monetary donations, and I can then complete a box on your behalf.

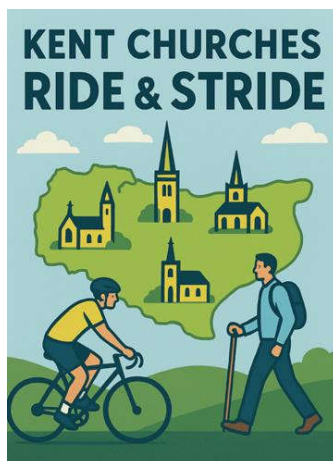
Afghanistan struck by devastating Earthquake

A powerful 6.0 magnitude earthquake struck eastern Afghanistan around midnight on Sunday. Entire villages have been flattened. Over 800 lives have already been lost, and families are still searching for loved ones. Homes made of mud crumbled instantly, and the shallow depth of the quake made it especially destructive. The worst-hit areas of Kunar and Nangarhar are remote, mountainous, and difficult to access. Communication is limited, and the full scale of the disaster is still unknown.
