"He calls his own sheep by name". John 10 v3.

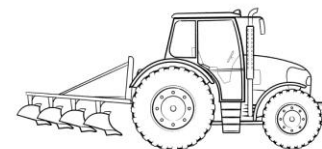

Candlemas is a Christian feast celebrated every year on **2 February**, marking a moment that sits at the crossroads of history, tradition, and symbolism. It's one of those quieter festivals that still carries a surprising amount of depth and beauty.

What Candlemas Commemorates

- It honours the **Presentation of Jesus at the Temple**, described in **Luke 2:22–40**, when Mary and Joseph brought the infant Jesus to Jerusalem 40 days after his birth.
- It also reflects the **Purification of the Virgin Mary**, a ritual prescribed by Jewish law after childbirth.

The name comes from the tradition of **blessing candles** during church services. Candles symbolize Christ as the “light of the world,” and many communities historically used this day to bless the candles they would use throughout the year.

Candlemas arrives **40 days after Christmas**, closing the extended cycle of celebrations around Jesus' birth. Some Christian traditions even keep Christmas decorations up until Candlemas.

In some cultures, it's also tied to weather folklore. It shares ancient roots with Candlemas predictions about winter's end.

Across Celtic, Germanic, and broader European folklore, **the time** was seen as a turning point in winter. People believed that the **weather on Candlemas** could predict whether winter would linger or fade. This idea long predates Christianity and was later woven into Candlemas customs.

A classic proverb recorded in British weather lore says:



*“If Candlemas Day be fair and bright,
Winter will have another fight.
If Candlemas Day brings cloud and rain,
Winter won't come again.”*



Germanic and British traditions used **hedgehogs** or **badgers** as the animals who “predicted” the weather on Candlemas (2 February).

If the animal **came out of its den** and the weather was **sunny**, it would see its shadow and retreat → **more winter ahead**

If the weather was **cloudy**, the animal wouldn't see its shadow → **spring would come sooner**
